## FREDERICKSBURG REGIONAL CONTINUUM OF CARE

The homeless population, at any given time, includes two basic groups. The first consists of unaccompanied individuals with disabling conditions that have resulted in long-term homelessness. The second group includes families as well as individuals, usually employed, who experience intermittent periods of homelessness because their permanent housing situation is precarious.

The Fredericksburg Regional Continuum of Care (FRCoC) serves as a coordinating organization for the various local groups addressing homelessness within Planning District 16. Participants include county and municipal governments, law enforcement agencies, non-profit groups, social services, businesses, churches and faith-based organizations. The FRCoC works collaboratively to develop cost-effective

solutions to address the multi-faceted causes of homelessness, eliminating existing cases of homelessness as feasible, and seeking to prevent new cases.



The FRCoC is committed to efforts that:

Link homeless persons and families and those at-risk of homelessness with shelter, transitional housing and affordable permanent housing.

Coordinate services through a web-based Homeless Management Information System that avoids duplicate efforts, thereby ensuring the greatest number of homeless families and individuals are served.

Foster collaboration and mutual support among community stakeholders working with the homeless and those at-risk of homelessness.

Provide a seamless continuum of support, services and housing to address the needs of those who are homeless within Planning District 16.



The purpose of the FRCoC is to: (1) identify and address the problems causing chronic homelessness; and to (2) provide a vehicle for community-wide assessment, planning and coordination of services to the region's homeless population.

The FRCoC will accomplish its purposes in the following ways:

- Assist with identifying the causes of homelessness in the community and region.
- Collaborate with individuals and organizations to seek and implement solutions to the causes and problems of homelessness.
- Provide technical assistance to members of the FRCoC, particularly in the identification of potential resource/grant opportunities.
- Evaluate and communicate the causes of and solutions to the problems of homelessness to the general public, community leaders, and elected officials.
- Provide an Annual Report on the state of homelessness and priority needs and issues affecting homeless persons, including availability of and access to affordable housing.
