
The Fredericksburg Arts Commission has inaugurated a public art project that will install large-scale outdoor sculptures at several sites around the City for a one-year period.


Calls for Entries went out to multiple websites. Thirty artists from 8 states and 4 countries submitted 40 works. A jury of local artists, gallery owners, curators, and studio art professors (with a representative of the Parks and Recreation Dept) ranked the entries. The first four works will be installed in late October 2016.

The Arts Commission thanks the staff at the Parks and Recreation Department for their guidance and support, and thanks the Economic Development Authority for funding.



Princess Anne at Route 1







Old Mill Park / Heritage Trail









VRE station: Frederick & Caroline Sts






